

ALBERT SULLIVAN SCHOLARSHIP

The University of Minnesota Foundation and the University of Minnesota Medical School invite applications for the **Albert Sullivan Scholarship** from individuals who have been admitted to the Medical School as members of the Class of 2022. Two non-renewable \$25,000 scholarships will be awarded to two separate first-year students (one scholarship each) to be paid in the first year of medical school.

The Albert Sullivan Scholarship was established in 1989 by an alumnus of the Medical School and supported with additional contributions from family, colleagues, and friends in honor of Albert Sullivan, M.D., Associate Dean for Admissions and Student Affairs and Associate Professor of Surgery. Preference will be given to applicants with undergraduate majors in the non-sciences. Preference will also be given to applicants where the funds may have the greatest impact on the student's education. Recipients of this scholarship are encouraged to contribute to the fund at a future date.

About Dr. Sullivan

Fondly known as "Sully" to staff and students, Dr. Sullivan was an active full-time faculty member at the University of Minnesota Medical School.

A 1947 graduate of Tulane University Medical School, Dr. Sullivan interned in Surgery at the University of Minnesota Medical School and joined the Department of Surgery in 1956. He was named Assistant Dean in 1968 and Associate Dean in 1973. During his tenure in the Dean's office, Dr. Sullivan oversaw the admissions process and through wise counseling and support, helped countless numbers of students through medical school. He died in 1990 after a brief illness.

An individual of broad and cosmopolitan interests and involvements, Dr. Sullivan was fluent in French and was knowledgeable in Spanish, Italian, Norwegian, and German. He was a superb cook, an avid gardener, an electronics enthusiast, and traveled worldwide. All his life he followed his own advice to students to read widely, travel, serve people, and learn as much as you can about as many things as you can. He believed deeply that medical students should be well-rounded individuals, and he always welcomed applications from students with undergraduate majors in the non-sciences and whose backgrounds included involvement in music, literature, the arts, travel, and other non-science areas.
